SAFEGUARDING - EVERYONE'S RESPONSIBILITY

EACH WEEK WE WILL SHARE SAFEGUARDING MESSAGES HERE FOR YOU EVERY CHILD HAS THE RIGHT TO BE SAFE, HEALTHY AND WELL.

The holiday season is a wonderful time of year, especially for children. But it is also a time for accidents and injuries.

By watching out for some common hazards you and your family can enjoy a happy, healthy season.

When decorating for the holidays, keep these tips in mind:

- Let children decorate within their reach with non-breakable items. Hang breakable decorations, ornaments, lightbulbs and tinsel out of children's reach
- Some holiday decorations can be poisonous. Watch out for plants like mistletoe, holly, Jerusalem cherry and amaryllis. These are toxic if swallowed. Bubble lights contain a chemical that's harmful if swallowed or gets on the skin. Keep these out of reach. Snow sprays are hazardous if the powder is swallowed or the aerosol is sprayed in eyes or on skin. If you think your child has been poisoned, call your doctor or telephone NHS 111.
- Prevent fire mishaps by making sure all your smoke alarms are working. Turn off holiday lights before going out or going to bed. Keep your natural tree well-watered. A dry tree can catch fire more easily. Secure your tree in a sturdy stand so it can't fall over. Keep it away from heat sources such as radiators or portable heaters. If you buy an artificial tree make sure it is labelled 'fire retardant.' When using candles keep them away from Christmas trees. Stay in the room where candles are lit. Supervise children near them and always blow them out before going to bed.


