Highlights from the Desk of the Executive Head..

Happy New Year! Every time I hear those words I cannot help but burst into Abba's song! I really hope that our vision for the future is that everyone is a friend.

It has been wonderful to see all the children this week and the staff smiling and happy to be back with each other and excited for the term ahead. Even though the decorations have been taken down the school is looking fabulous with new doors decorated to reflect the topic of the year group. As you walk down KS2 corridor a giant mouth on Year 4 door smiles in anticipation of learning all about the human body and on the Year 2 door you are invited in to learn how to be a street detective through an enticing pathway. Some of the doors are on this week's newsletter. One day soon you will all be able to visit again and enjoy the creativity that radiates through our school.

Mrs Withers and I visited all the classes today as part of our regular monitoring and there was a real range of our curriculum on offer. Reception demonstrated how they use their phonics to read and were going on a hunt to find the objects or pictures that matched the word in their hand. Year One were exploring the spelling of tricky words such as 'they' and how they use their recall of sounds to learn to spell. I walked into a lesson on Shakespeare's text in Year 2 and the children were gathering words for a glossary from the text they were reading; it was full of words such as 'yesteryear', 'solemnly' and 'hurly burly.' They were learning the meanings and the challenge is to get you all at home to use them in a conversation! As I walked into Year 3 Dottie said to me "Mrs Humphriss, can I tell you what we are learning about?" Naturally the answer was yes. They were exploring whether they would like to be King or Queen and what they would introduce in the country as their first thing if they were the monarch. I loved that Dominic said he would plant trees and stop plastic in the oceans. Sam wanted to make all people equal! Such a mature understanding and full of humanitarianism. I then moved into the world of maths in Year 4 as they explored word problems and used their knowledge of number facts to solve them, whilst Year 5 recapped earlier knowledge on Shakespeare and his background before moving into Reading Vipers where they are exploring Shakespeare's glorious language. Just outside our office door is a huge portrait of Shakespeare created by Year 5 surrounded by quotes they have explored. It was back to maths in year 6 and factors. I was super impressed at the speed in which the children recalled factors of numbers. Great revision.

We are looking forward to a term of Shakespeare and National Storytelling week. All of the staff have been recommending books for the children to read and there was much laughter in Mrs Wither's and my office as we attempted to take selfies with our favourite stories. We will share these at some point with you all.
