STAY SAFE IN A DIGITAL WORLD

Which is safer: Roblox or Minecraft?

Roblox and Minecraft are both sandbox style games that allow players to be highly creative in imaginary worlds. These games are very popular with children because they are easy to play and allow players the freedom to create while socializing with others. Both games have a multiplayer function that allows users to chat with one another while they are playing the game. However, as with all online chat platforms, there can be some safety risks for children when engaging with these games. Minecraft and Roblox have both reported incidents of inappropriate content for children. Roblox has utilized human moderators and chat filters and players can block other users and report bad behaviour. This makes it slightly safer than Minecraft, which does not have the 'under 13 safe chat.' Nor does it give parents the ability to log on and monitor their child's game.

Always make sure your children are playing where you can see them and check in with them. You wouldn't let them play out of sight from you in the park so keep an eye on them when they are online.

For children Childline is always open. Call 0800 1111. When life feels difficult they can help.




