SAFEGUARDING - IS EVERYONE'S RESPONSIBILITY

During the holidays children spend more time on devices; gaming, social media, watching Youtube or Tiktok. It is really important that we keep children safe online and also teach them how to use devices safely and keep themselves safe. It is also important that they do not access material that is not suitable for their age group.

Internet Matters has a range of resources available for parents/carers where you can activate parental controls to manage children's devices or your own if you lend them to your children. Follow this link

We would also advise that you limit the time your child is on devices – take them out of the room especially mobile phones to keep them safe. You wouldn't let your child play in the middle of the road because it isn't safe – the internet and social media isn't either. Protect your child.

- Do not knock on the doors of strangers - only go to people you know. Never go into a stranger's house.
- Always keep to well-lit areas. Wear bright clothing and always carry a torch. Remember road safety.
- Unless pre-arranged, do not visit elderly members of the community. Be careful not to frighten vulnerable people.
- Keep your tricks within the law anything that results in damage is an offence and will be dealt with as such.

MESSAGE FROM THE DESK OF MRS HUMPHRISS



Let's start off with a huge thank you to The Friends of Stratford Primary School who work tirelessly to raise funds for the children to improve the resources that are available to them. On Friday the first of the year's discos took place and everyone had great fun. There is a lot goes on behind the scenes to make these go with a swing. So thank you to all of the volunteers and the committee.

Our school council led an assembly last week to share their action plan for 2024/2025. They work with Mrs Bean and are focussed this year on reducing waste; food, plastics and paper. They also want to improve playtimes for everyone. There first initiative is to introduce 'SIT & SNACK' to make sure that all the children whilst they are eating their snack at break sit down and digest it properly. They are also developing a quiet space for people to sit and chat or read or play quiet games. They are taking part in a Waste Free workshop this week and will be working with Let's Go Zero to develop a climate change action plan. All schools in the UK must have this in place by the end of 2025.

We had our annual trust safeguarding audit last week. This is an intensive audit to ensure that we do everything we can to keep children safe and are compliant. Part of the audit is pupil interviews. A number of our children spoke with the trust lead for safeguarding. She was super impressed by the children's knowledge of how to stay safe online and how to seek adult support through their network of 5. All of the children spoken to said they felt very safe in school and knew they were looked after by staff.

Year 4 were taught how to stay safe in on and offline relationships including work on child on child abuse & exploitation and domestic abuse when Loudmouth production visited. It is important that children are taught appropriate relationships and learn to keep themselves safe. Loudmouth deliver this in an appropriate manner for the age of the children.

Coming up this week is parent consultations we look forward to seeing everyone at this appointments and of course it is Halloween dress up this week in return for FOSP donations for Christmas fair. Yes I am afraid I have had to mention the word! It is approaching! Have a great half term when it comes – stay safe and have fun. See you in November!
