The dark web – what do you know about it?

Here are 5 things you need to know:

- 1. The dark net is not a complex secretive environment. It is no more complicated than using an app on your phone.
- 2. If you talk about the dark net, you actually mean TOR (short for the onion router). To access the dark net you only need to go to torproject.org. BBC news and Facebook use the dark net.
- 3. There is a legitimate use to the dark net. It has privacy technology.
- 4. The dark net's combination of encryption, support for privacy and ease of use creates a simple environment for criminals to exploit
- 5. A tor user who is committing criminal transactions will use cryptocurrencies, such as BITCOIN.




British Science Week




Woohoo to boys' football. They had fantastic teamwork and communication and in their match against Thomas Jolyffe drew 2-2.
