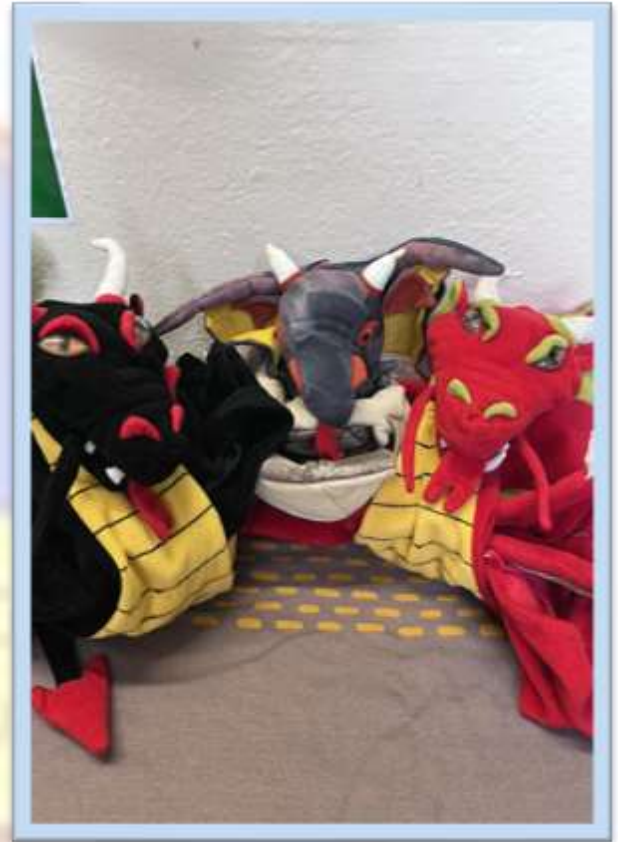

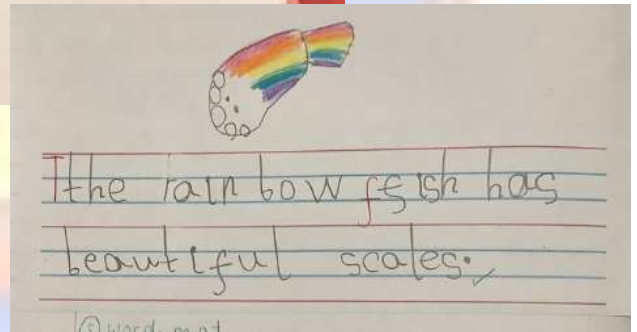
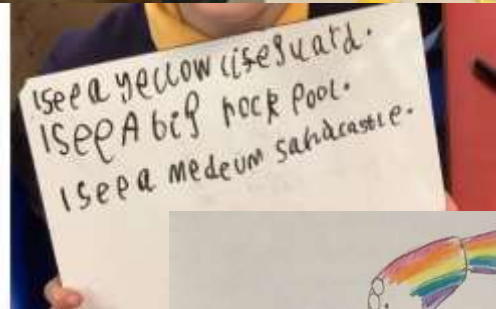

Reception have been really working on their foundational skills. Learning to read using their phonological knowledge and developing their sentences.



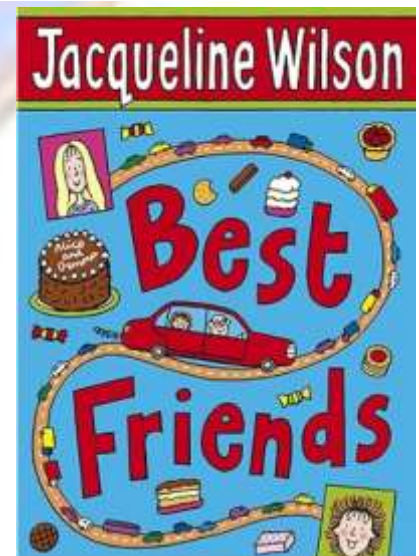
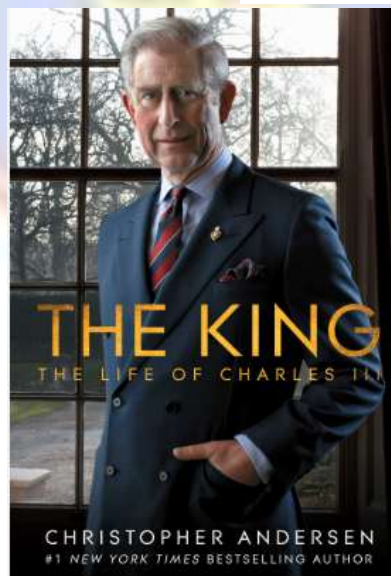
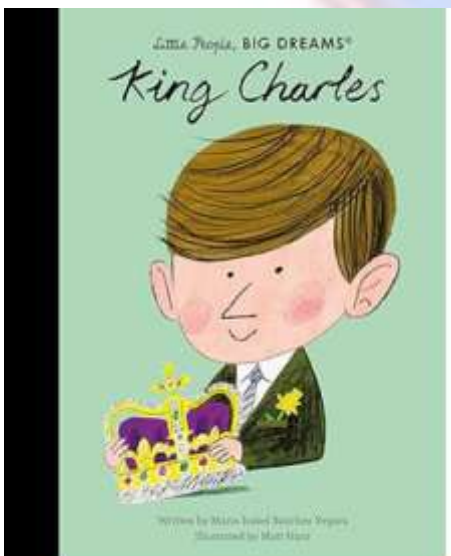
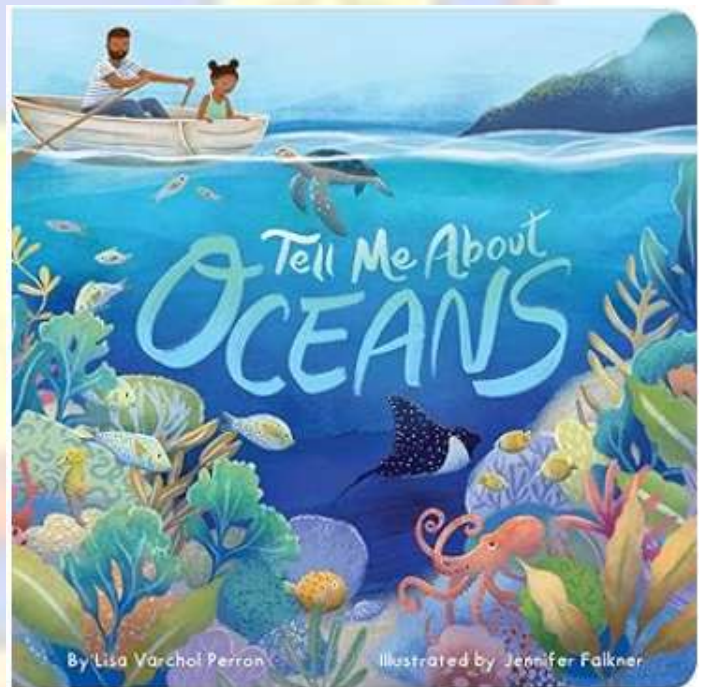
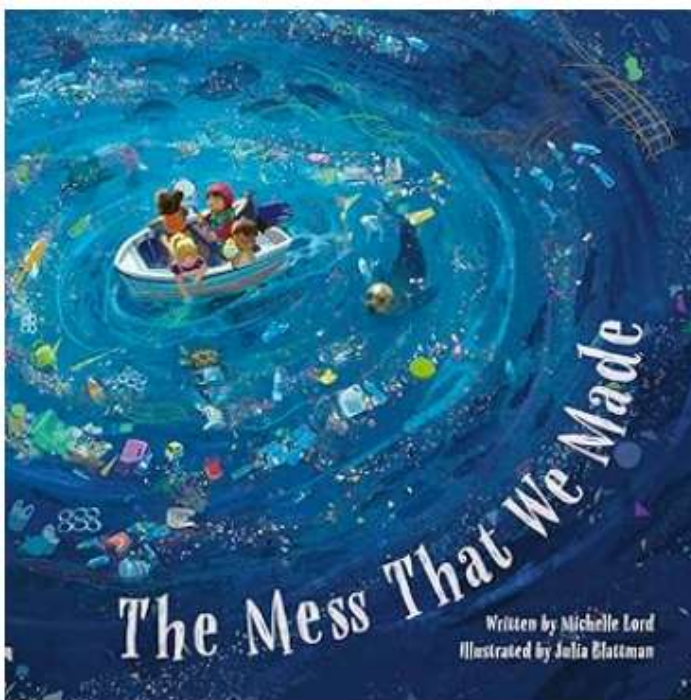

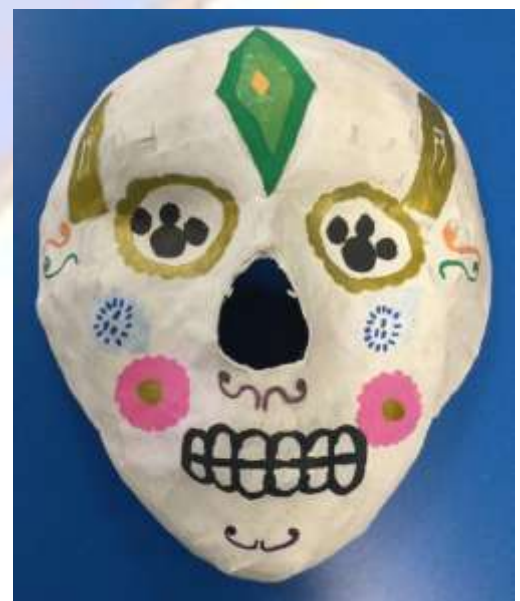
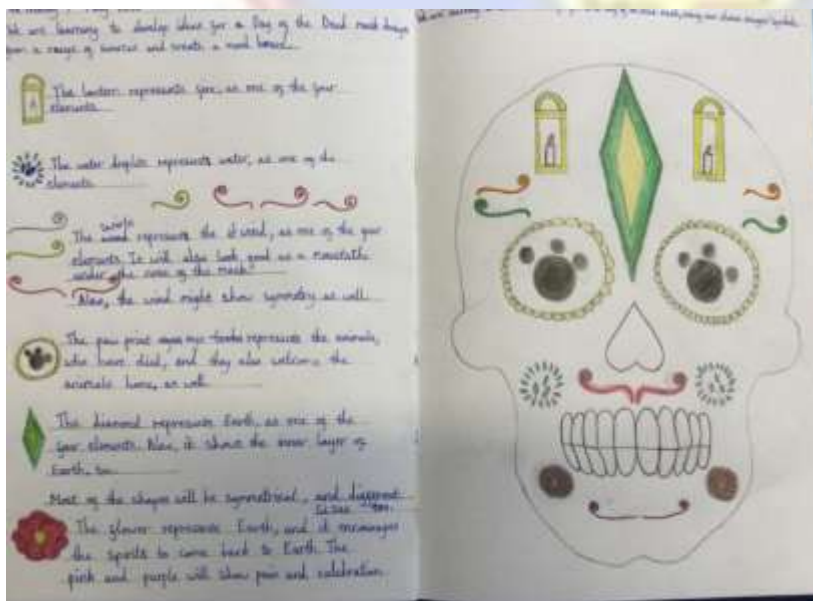
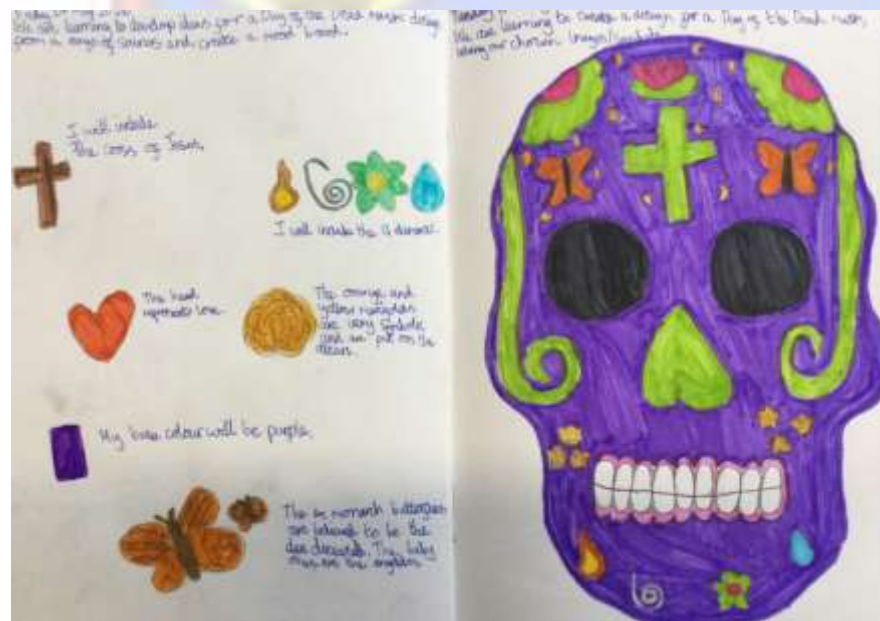
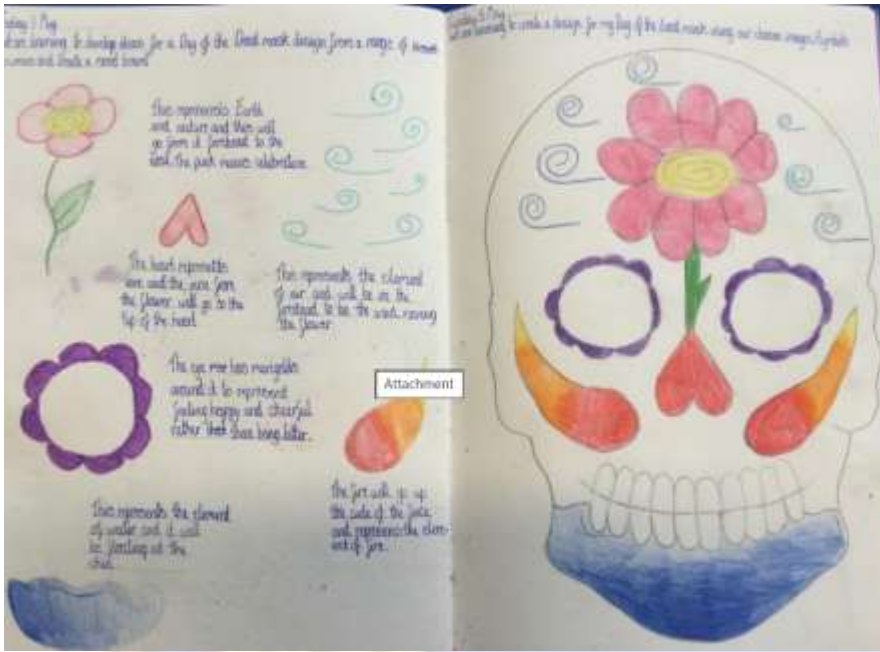
Book Recommendations

This week in assembly we explored friendship as it is National Best Friends Day. It is also The King's Official Birthday and Oceans Day. Let's all work on saving our oceans.





Year Five had a brilliant start to their Summer 2 term. They were visited by Longborough Opera to learn an opera in a day. Year 5 learnt musical techniques and operatic moves to form the chorus for Hansel and Gretel. They then performed to the rest of the school. We are grateful to anonymous benefactors for making this happen. Year 5 also explored which material makes the best insulator during Science. They measured temperature change with patience and precision.



Year Six have been working incredibly hard on their Day of The Dead masks. You can see the process from their initial design thought processes to the finished product. They explored the Day of the Dead festival. Then they decided on the images they wanted to include on their mask and created a mood board. They designed their mask using chosen images and symbols. The penultimate stage was to create a papier mache mask, using brown parcel paper and a plastic face mask. Once complete, they removed them from the plastic mask. Finally, they used acrylic paints to create our finished masks.

What is HAF?

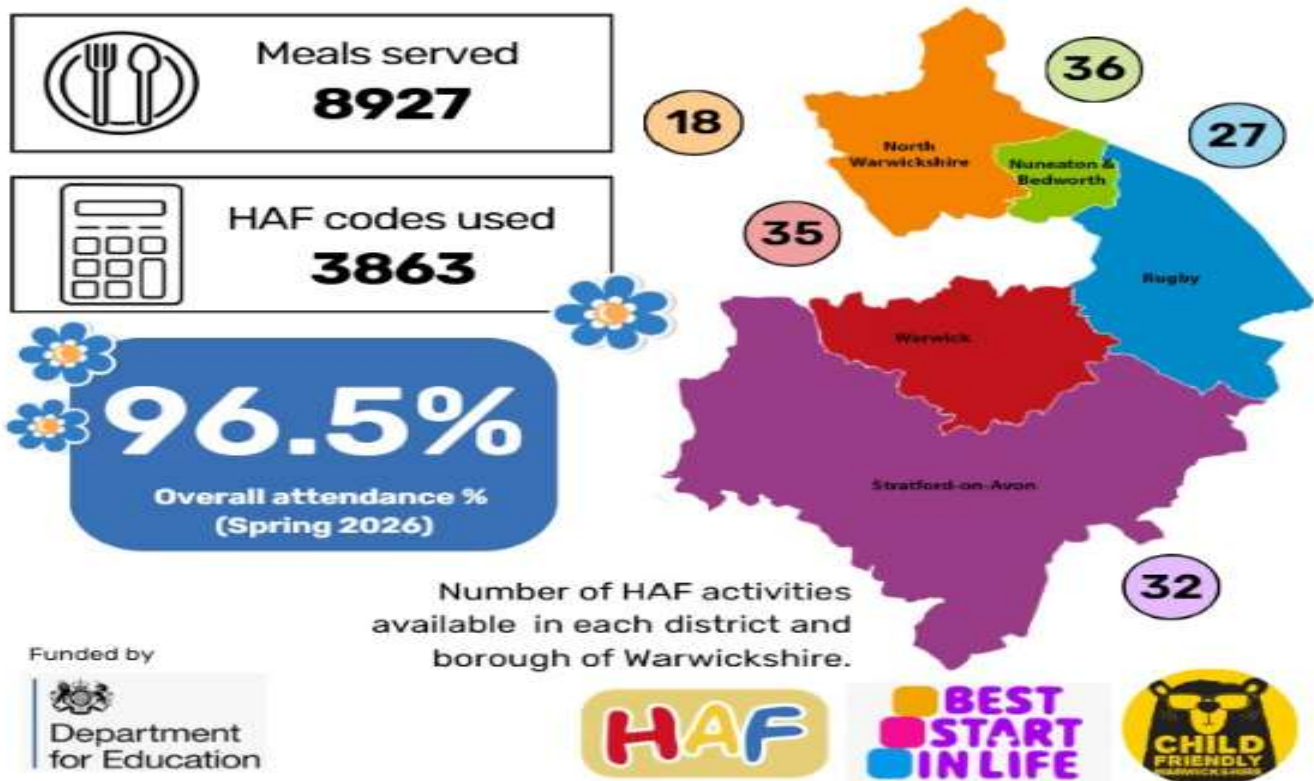
The Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) programme is a Department for Education funded initiative aimed at pupils in school years Reception through to Year 11 who are eligible for benefits-related FSM (free school meals).

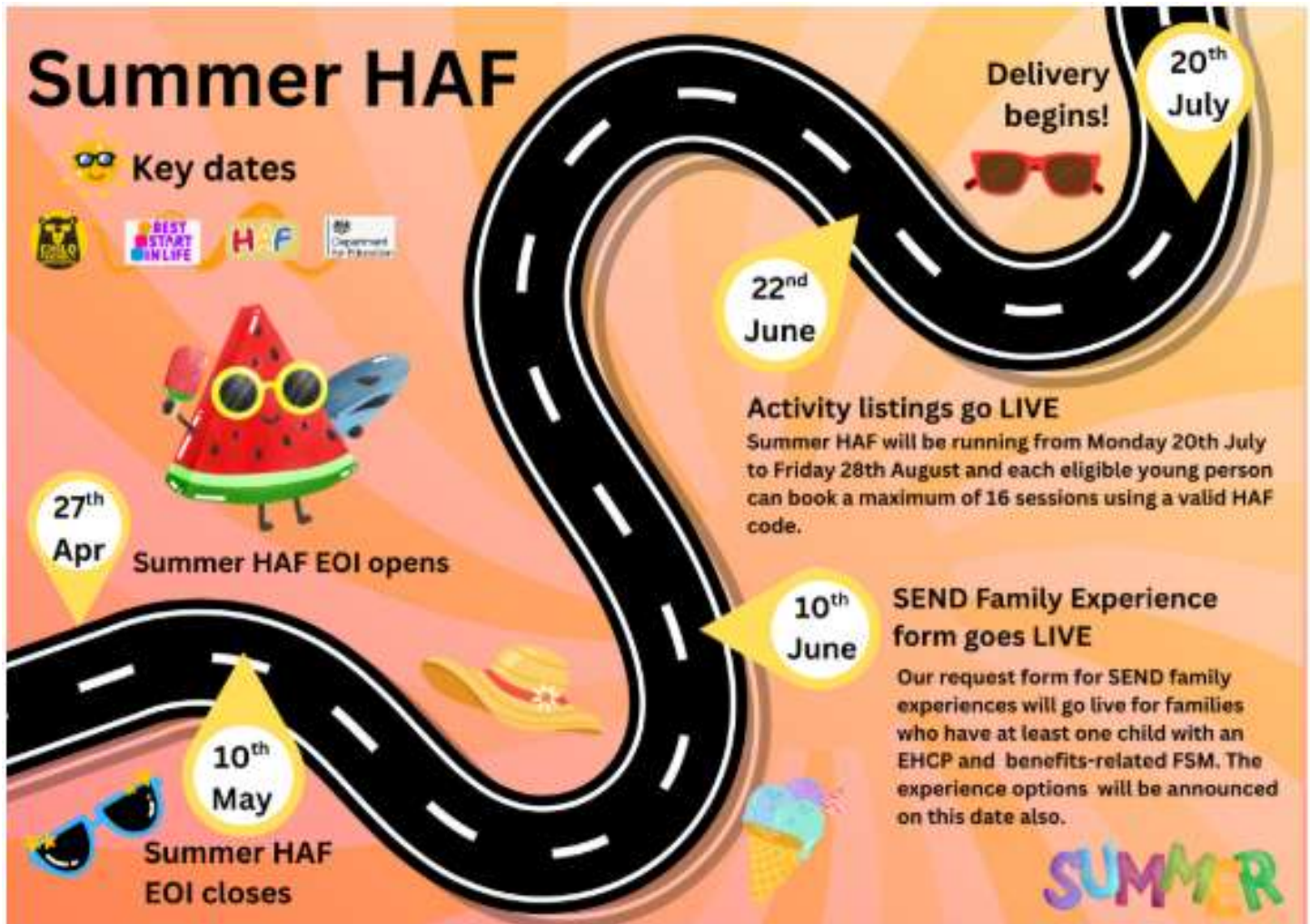
The next HAF period will be over the summer holidays, where eligible young people can access a maximum of 16 days funded activities, as well as a meal.

Please note that with the upcoming changes to benefits-related FSM, from September 2026 HAF eligibility will be aligned with Targeted FSM and not Expanded FSM.
