We generally ask the children what they are learning about in their lessons. One visit has really stayed in my mind because we asked a group of children how they know they are learning. One boy told me that he knows he is learning when he makes mistakes. I thought that was a brilliant answer. I've told the colleagues I work with about it. Sometimes we can think it's a bad thing to make mistakes and it was lovely to be reminded that they are an important part of learning and developing.

On behalf of the school governors we say a very big thank you to all of the staff, children, families and carers that make up our school community. Child Exploitation is happening in Warwickshire! Don't ignore it. Children and young people have a right to be safe and should be protected from all forms of abuse. It's everyone's responsibility to spot the signs of child exploitation and protect children and young people in Warwickshire. Exploitation affects hundreds of children and young people every year in Warwickshire. By knowing the tell-tale signs, we can all play an important role in reducing that number.

#### What to look out for:

- receiving unexplained and expensive gifts or money, having no money but in possession of cigarettes, alcohol and other expensive items (could be a sign of running up debt)
- having new and significantly older friends, being picked up from school by strangers
- substance use (drugs / alcohol), changes in mood
- showing signs of self-harm, regularly going missing from school and home
- staying out late, being secretive about where they are going
- being secretive with their mobile phone, laptop, tablet or other electronic devices
- lack of interest in activities and hobbies


