



If the school has to close we will be setting work on eschools each day for the children. There will be a maths and English task and another subject set on a daily basis. There are a variety of tasks linked to our curriculum and progression skills.

1. Go to our school website and click the green login box at the top right hand corner or type Stratford e schools into a search engine. Click on the link Login/Stratford-upon-avon primary school and it will take you to the box displayed here.
