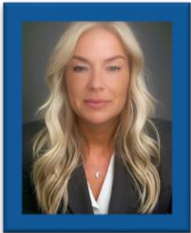

Despite the sickness in school last week, I have still managed to make my way around the school and have been delighted to see some incredible learning happening in every corner.

In Reception, the children have been practicing writing their names and learning about their families. They've shown great enthusiasm for this and have already made significant progress. We also managed to sneak in a fun movement activity with the "Waka Waka" dance, which the children thoroughly enjoyed—there were lots of smiles and laughter!

Year 1 took their learning outdoors this week, exploring the signs of autumn in their outdoor area. The children were thrilled to spot some orange and brown leaves, noticing how the seasons are beginning to change. Year 3 had a lovely river walk this week as part of their new learning about Hinduism. They observed the ceremony of Ganesh Chaturthi, a Hindu festival that celebrates the birthday of Lord Ganesha. It was a wonderful experience for them to witness this cultural event and gain a deeper understanding of its significance.

Year 4 have enjoyed Miss Postlethwaite teaching them. Whilst Miss P is on crutches Mrs Archer took Year 5 bell boating and Miss P taught Year 4. The children had fun learning maths, English and History. They are looking forward to their Heart of England visit.

I also had the pleasure of joining Year 5 on an exciting trip to the opening of Gail's Bakery in town. The children learned about the early morning routines of bakers, though most weren't too keen on the idea of a 5 a.m. start! The children represented our school wonderfully and were rewarded with a tasty treat, which they all thoroughly enjoyed.

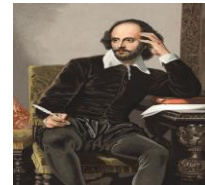
All in all, it has been a busy but incredibly rewarding week. We're looking forward to many more exciting adventures in the weeks to come!
