



#### Year 3's LENT walk - part of their curriculum learning for Religious Education

Year 3 embarked on an enriching learning walk to deepen their understanding of Lent and Easter weekend. Phil guided the children through the parables of Lent, explaining the significance of each key day and how parishioners participate in church services. Through a "spot the difference" activity, the children observed how the church takes on a more sombre appearance during Lent compared to other times of the year.

They explored the themes of sacrifice, positive action, and good deeds, learning about the symbolism of the colour purple and the ash crosses marked on foreheads on Ash Wednesday. They discovered the meaning of palm crosses, representing Jesus' return to Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, and even re-enacted the Procession of Palms. Their understanding of Maundy Thursday and the Last Supper was further
