SAFEGUARDING - IS EVERYONE'S RESPONSIBILITY

Focus On: County Lines and Child Criminal Exploitation (CCE)

County lines refers to the practice where gangs or organised crime groups exploit children to move and sell drugs. This often involves transporting drugs from larger cities, where the gangs are based, to smaller towns, sometimes crossing county borders. However, it can also take place locally, within the same area or borough. The children involved are given specific mobile phone 'lines' to handle drug orders. Criminals often use children because they are less likely to attract the attention of the police, reducing the risk of adult dealers being arrested.

County lines is a form of **child criminal exploitation**, which occurs when an individual or group takes advantage of their influence over a young person to pressure, manipulate, or coerce them into committing crimes. Alarmingly, children as young as six have been targeted by gangs for this purpose.

Recruitment often happens through a process known as **grooming**, where the exploiter builds a relationship with the young person to gain their trust. Social media and peer groups are also common ways young people are recruited.

Parents of children exploited through county lines have often noticed a sudden change in behaviour. Possible warning signs include:

- Unexplained money, clothing, or gifts
- Frequent, unexplained phone calls
- New friendships with older children or adults
- Missing school or truancy
- Carrying weapons

YEARS 3 - 6 FRIDAY

Children in KS2 will be studying our thrilling Virtual Reality and Machine Learning modules.

In our 'Virtual Reality' module, children design and build worlds which they code to be interactive with the user. They then design and build VR worlds in three dimensions which they code to be interactive. Parents and carers will be able to view the children's learning from home on a phone and/or a VR headset. This Machine Learning module uses the free online resource Machine Learning for Kids in combination with the Scratch coding platform to provide children with hands-on experience for training machine learning systems (AI) and building things with them.
