Their most successful game they won 8-0!!

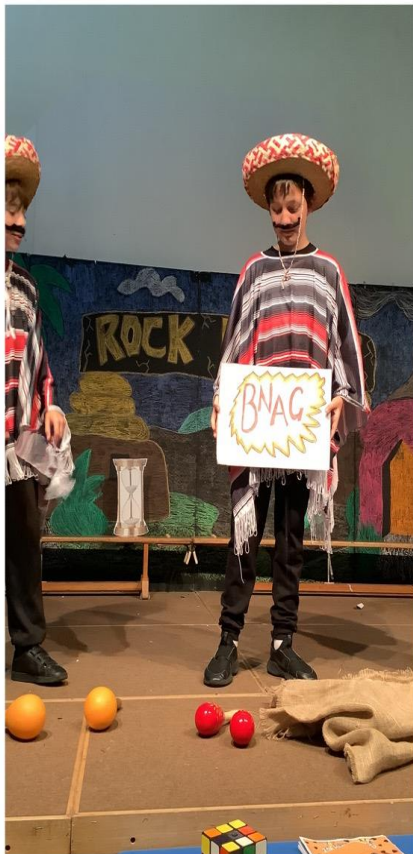

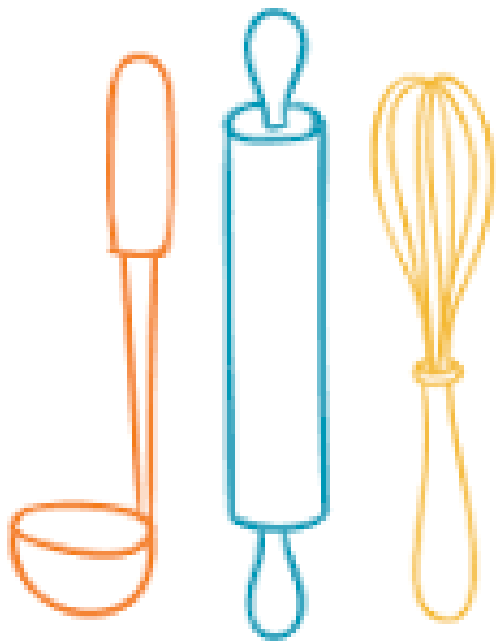
