Highlights from the Desk of the Head of School..

This week, we have carried out a Science Deep Dive across the school, which was a fantastic opportunity to explore the science curriculum and observe lots of budding scientists in action! Year 1 were very excited to discover that there was (and still is) a dinosaur on the loose around the school - the children were showing me photographs of a diplodocus under their tables and they suspect it was also responsible for leaving a mess in the classroom! The children have informed me that he is hiding in my office cupboard so I am keeping my eyes peeled for clues. In their science lesson, the children were learning about animal classification and could tell me the different characteristics for mammals, amphibians, fish, birds and reptiles. I was very impressed with the interesting debate that the class had when classifying a dolphin - they worked collectively to figure out that a dolphin is indeed a mammal not a fish! In Year 2, the children were wowing us with their understanding and use of scientific vocabulary - they were building constructions using biscuits and could explain that a triangle is the strongest shape to use when building structures. In Year 3, you could have heard a pin drop during their science lesson - Mr Edwards and the children were learning about fossilisation and were making their own fossils using clay, model animals and plaster of paris. I really was impressed when the children were talking to me about fossilisation. They were confidently and accurately using words like permeable, erosion, sedimentary, durable and disintegrated to tell me about the process and their enjoyment was delightful! In Year 4 this week, the children have been continuing to learn about electricity and were deep in discussion about electrical appliances. The children have been investigating electrical insulators and conductors and this also started a great discussion about the use of electrical appliances and environmental impact. We have already started to think about our energy usage in the school and evidently have some eco-warriors in the making. Year 5 have been using different foods to represent each stage of the human gestation cycle this week and worked brilliantly together to match each food item to each stage. What really struck me was the children's ability to recall prior learning - their understanding of scientific vocabulary was impressive and their enthusiasm and enjoyment of the subject was inspiring, as it was in Year 6 too. This week, there has been a freezer full of ice cubes - the children have been setting up their own scientific enquiries, based on their topic Frozen Kingdom. Mrs McCormack challenged the class to pose their own scientific questions for enquiry based on melting icebergs. One group designed an investigation to investigate if salt would speed up the melting process; another group tested if having lots of iceberg 'bits' surrounding an iceberg would speed up the melting process and another group decided to investigate if the size of the iceberg contributed to the speed 🦲 of melting. The children spoke so knowledgably about their science lessons and couldn't wait to tell me about another investigation that they had carried out last week when they were exploring thermal insulators and working scientifically to keep penguins warm! These are the types of experiences that children will remember forever. It's been another super week with lots of inspiring learning taking place!
