

Since 2013 Pantosaurus has helped over six million to talk PANTS and help keep children safe from sexual abuse.


Talk PANTS is here to help children understand that they have the right to say no and if they need to speak out about something, someone will listen.







This is a vital part of funding in schools and we encourage everyone to take a good look at whether your child is eligible or not. It isn't just about receiving free lunches. Every child who is eligible receives support for uniform, school trips, extra-curricular activities and interventions within school. You will also be able to access free holiday club activities. Please take the time to explore this source of funding. The leaflet is also available in a variety of languages - see links below.

Also below I have put the results of the recent survey on how children travelled to school on Tuesday 16th September 2025. We have an equal amount of people walking to travelling in cars and a small number coming to school by bicycle. We are keen to increase the amount of children who come to school by bike. Can I apply?

Your child could be eligible for free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support or Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support from National Asylum Support Service (NASS)
- · Guarantee Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax
 Credit) with an annual income of no more than
 £16,190
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

Calling Year 6 - deadline to apply for a secondary school place for September 2026 is 31st October 2025. If you apply by this date you will receive your child's school offer on National offer day - 2nd March 2026. 

Stratford upon Avon Primary Bike Bus

It runs every Tuesday and Thursday morning (exce pt for this week where the Thursday will move to Fri day due to the local MP Manuela Perteghella taking part).

The bike bus is run by Trevor Bruce (his son is in Year 3).

Stop 1 - shared use path by entrance to race cours e (meet path side of the barriers, don't block the pat h) - 8.10am

Stop 2 - Seymour Road (meet by the first bend, ent rance to the lane, wait on the pavement) - 8.15am

Stop 3 - Paddock Lane (meet on the shared use pa th, path side of the barriers. Please be respectful to the residents who live here, wait on the grass or in t he dead end road of Weatherby Way adjacent) - 8. 20am

Stop 4 - Greenway car park (river side, be aware of moving cars, no riding in car park while waiting, for your own safety) - 8.25am

Arrive at school - 8.40am

***Please note, timings are approximate, please be at your stop, ready, a

few minutes before the scheduled

time

Check on the whatsapp group as I

will share my location (which isn't

always accurate) and let me know if you're late etc. If I know you are coming we will wait as long as pos sible, but it is usually only 1 or 2 minutes we can wait. Listen to Trevor's instructions.
