We have busy days in Year 2! It is important children arrive on time!

As soon as the children arrive at school, they will hang their coat and bag upon their peg, which has their photograph and name above it.


They sit at their tables to quietly complete the morning Color Monster activity, and then begin handwriting practice during registration.

They then move straight into the morning sessions which consist of the core subjects English, Phonics (changing to Spelling) and Mathematics.

After lunch, they will cover Topic based learning - including P.E. and Outdoor Learning.

Throughout the day, we have lots of time for independent reading, whole class reading, and an extra 15 minute maths "blast" to build fluency and recall.

Every day ends with a Tidy-up Challenge which encourages the children to work as a team to look after their belongings and our classroom. We finish the day with story time.




Assessment

Assessment happens at every opportunity when the children are working, with live marking happening during lessons so that they receive speedy feedback.

This also means that I can tailor the next steps in their learning journeys to fill their specific knowledge gaps and to address misconceptions, or to offer additional challenges when we're ready for it. The children have time to respond to feedback in order to make changes or to deepen their knowledge and understanding.

Any child that did not meet the expected score for the phonics screening test in Year 1 will have an opportunity to try again at the end of Year 2.



Core subjects



English:

Our writing is based upon a whole class text that is normally linked to that term's topic. Whole-class story-time ends each day and encourages children to become immersed in a text which is trickier than that which they can read by themselves. We have interesting discussions about characters and plot points. This means by the end of the half term they will have read and understood a novel as well as a range of shorter fiction and non-fiction texts.




Core subjects



Maths:

Maths Mastery is about deepening children's mathematical knowledge and understanding, and providing meaningful opportunities for them to apply their skills. We use lots of concrete manipulatives and 'hands on' learning to help children to build mental mathematical models. We will begin with place value, addition and subtraction in Autumn. They will also be studying 2D shapes with Mr Kelly and applying their mathemetical skills when working on their STEM projects.

We also have a 'Maths Blast' each afternoon which helps the children to improve their speed and accuracy when using their arithmetic skills. This is our opportunity to remember things we've learned previously that we'd otherwise be in danger of forgetting!



The wider curriculum

Throughout the year, the children will be learning the full breadth of our curriculum - including Science, Music, Computing, R.E., P.E. and French. They will also be working on exciting STEM projects with Mr Kelly.

History and Geography will weave through our topic curriculum. Our projects will be:





















Monday 15th Kings & Queens for the day!

Things to try

Use a hundred square (you can print these off online or ask your child's class teacher for a copy) and hide different numbers with counters. Ask your child to say and write the hidden numbers in numerals and words.

Children will also need to complete the 1-Minute Maths Challenge on the White Rose app at least 3 times a week.



Home-learning: Spellings

Children are also expected to practise 10 spellings every week which use the spelling pattern that we've been learning about that week.

The spelling practise sheet will contain the 10 words and 5 columns for them to practise writing each word in.

These may also be spellings that we have noticed they need to practise, or be common exception words, or be often-used words that they should know.

When learning their spellings, children should also be practising their handwriting so please encourage your child to form each letter properly and to write neatly with correct ascenders and descenders. You will therefore need to be watching them as they write please.

I will give Class Dojos for every sheet of quality work the children complete each week, so please make sure sheets are returned into bags on a Friday to earn their rewards!

The children will have a weekly Spelling Quiz on a Friday.

Friday: Collecting sheets, quizzing, providing new spellings.














No bits and bobs from home please - other than a water bottle.

School uniform / PE kits / snack pots should all be clearly labelled and it is the children's responsibility to look after these.




We are proud of our presentation - in school and when completing homework.


