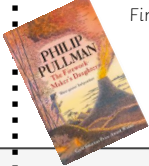
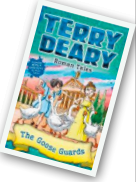
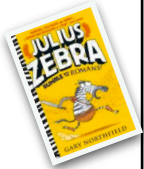

<u>Democracy</u> Explore how early communities made decisions <u>Rule of Law</u> In prehistoric societies, there were informal rules and social norms to maintain order within groups. <u>Individual Liberty</u> Examine how early humans exercised freedom of choice within survival constraints (e.g., where to live, what tools to make). <u>Tolerance and respect</u> Explore how different tribes and cultures migrated and brought diverse practices to Britain. Encourage discussion on how cultural exchange shaped communities, reinforcing modern tolerance and inclusion.		<u>Democracy</u> Debate the best places to live near tectonic zones or how societies should respond to natural disasters. <u>Rule of Law</u> Discuss building regulations and safety laws in earthquake/volcanic regions and why rules are essential to protect communities. <u>Individual Liberty</u> Link to respecting others' right to make different decisions (e.g., people who choose to live near volcanoes for fertile soil). Tolerance and respect communities affected by disasters work together and respect each other's roles in rebuilding.		<u>Democracy</u> Explore how voting worked in Ancient Rome and discuss why we value equal voting rights today. <u>Rule of Law</u> Romans introduced laws and courts that influenced British law. Discuss importance of laws for fairness and safety. <u>Individual Liberty</u> Discuss how life was different for Roman citizens vs. slaves or conquered peoples—link to the importance of freedom and human rights. <u>Tolerance and respect</u> Learn how cooperation between Roman citizens and local people was essential for peace and success.
