A group of selected children attended Warwickshire's Road Safety Awards on Friday with me. Android Smartphone parent guide

Setting up parental controls is a great way to support your child's online safety. However, these can't work alone. Regular conversations, check ins and consistent boundaries are also vital for keeping your child safe. Never assume it will be ok!

SEND NEWS or support

For many young people with Special Educational Needs or Disabilities (SEND), the internet can be a place where they feel safe, calm and in control. Somewhere they can make friends without having to communicate face-to-face, and build a community which they may not have in their offline life. Whilst recognising the internet is a great resource which young people enjoy using, life online for a child with SEND may pose additional challenges that require careful management and support.

There are so many positive opportunities for young people online, such as communicating with friends, watching videos or playing games. The internet is an amazing resource for many reasons and it's important to recognise how much young people love using it.

Whether your child is verbal or non-verbal, the moment your child expresses and interest in the internet, is the time to talk about, discuss or show ways in which they can stay safe online. Take time to discuss CONTENT, CONTACT AND CONDUCT.

TREVOR BRUCE AND HARRIET EVANS WILL BE LEADING THE BIKE BUS FROM NOW ON

If you wish to join the bike bus let the school office know and we will share Trevor's phone number so you can be added to the whatsapp group. Below is a photo of the route they take.

Stop 1 - shared use path by entrance to race course (meet path side of the barriers, don't block the path) -8.10am

Stop 2 - Seymour Road (meet by the first bend, entrance to the lane, wait on the pavement) - 8.15am

Stop 3 - Paddock Lane (meet on the shared use path, path side of the barriers. Please be respectful to the residents who live here, wait on the grass or in the dead end road of Weatherby Way adjacent) - 8.20am

Stop 4 - Greenway car park (river side, be aware of moving cars, no riding in car park while waiting, for your own safety) - 8.25am

Arrive at school - 8.40am

***Please note, timings are approximate, please be at your stop, ready, a few minutes before the scheduled time.

Check on the whatsapp group as I will share my location (which isn't always accurate) and let me know if you're late etc.

If I know you are coming we will wait as long as possible, but it is usually only 1 or 2 minutes we can wait.
